UPDATE FROM THE CE

We've been very busy here at Hospice over the last few months and have some great news to share about the results of the hard mahi that we're doing.

A huge goal here at Hospice, and a significant part of our kaupapa, is to reach out and deliver our services into the community. Our Whānau Support Team have been working tirelessly over the last few months, working with clients and their whānau to meet their social, spiritual and practical needs. These visits often take place in client's homes, in hospitals, or aged care facilities, and often fly under the radar when it comes to the visibility of our work in the community. This work is a huge part of what we do and has an immeasurable effect on the outcomes for the people we serve.

Sometimes to make room for new services we have to say goodbye to ones that have been running for a while. Our Thursday programme held its last official day in March. This tight-knit group will continue to meet weekly for morning tea at Hospice under a fully volunteer and client-led service. Our Creative Hands programme has also finished up after holding a long-standing place in our schedule. We are so grateful to the volunteers who have helped run these programmes over many years, they have made a significant difference in people's lives and hold a special place in the history of Hospice Wairarapa.

We've recently been able to recruit more exceptional people to our team and Board.
