## **CARTER COURT PALLIATIVE SUITE**

Hopefully you will have already caught up with the exciting news that Hospice Wairarapa is partnering with Carter Court Rest Home in Carterton to establish a fully equipped dedicated palliative care room there - the first of its kind in the Wairarapa.



Builders are now on site and fantastic progress is already being made.

Hospice Wairarapa is funding the cost of renovation, and Carter Court will provide day to day delivery of patient care alongside the specialist Kahukura palliative care nursing team and other medical and social support teams.

The new suite will be truly fit-for-purpose with facilities such as a whānau area and kitchenette, pull down bed for family use and an external access, which will make a big difference in ensuring patients and their whānau feel welcome and comfortable.

The renovation will be undertaken with input from a small group of clinical experts, iwi representatives, Māori, and Pasifika health providers to ensure it meets clinical needs for

delivering care, while also having a home-like environment that is accessible for all.

The community has been asking Hospice Wairarapa to deliver an in-patient palliative service for some time, but the cost of establishing and running a standalone facility would have been prohibitive. This innovative partnership approach and the central location in Carterton will make palliative care services more accessible for an increased number of people across the region.

We aim to bless and officially open the suite and welcome our first guests early in the new year.

### Rei Kōtuku

There was a great turnout of local health providers to the Rei Kōtuku presentation we recently hosted at the REAP Education Centre in Masterton.

Rei Kōtuku provide specialist paediatric palliative and bereavement care to pēpi, tamariki, rangatahi and their whānau in the Central Region of Aotearoa.

They work with parents who have received an antenatal diagnosis of their baby, as well as babies, tamariki and rangatahi with serious illness. They also work collaboratively with clinicians, external agencies and the community to provide what is needed, by the right person, at the right time.

### **Specialist Palliative Care Equipment for the Community**

We've recently approved the donation of nearly \$15,000 worth of specialist palliative care equipment to Wairarapa Hospital to be used in people's homes.

This donation has helped fulfil a wish list of high-demand equipment such as electric beds, lifts and reclining chairs, walking frames, sit-to-stand aids and pressure aid cushions. The equipment will make life much easier for the Kahukura specialist palliative care nurses, palliative care patients and of course their whānau and carers.

We'll continue this great relationship with the hospital and put a long-term plan in place to make sure the community has the equipment it needs to ensure people can be as mobile and as comfortable as possible when being cared for in their homes.

All the money raised from in-store sales of the Christmas bauble will stay in the Wairarapa to support our community.



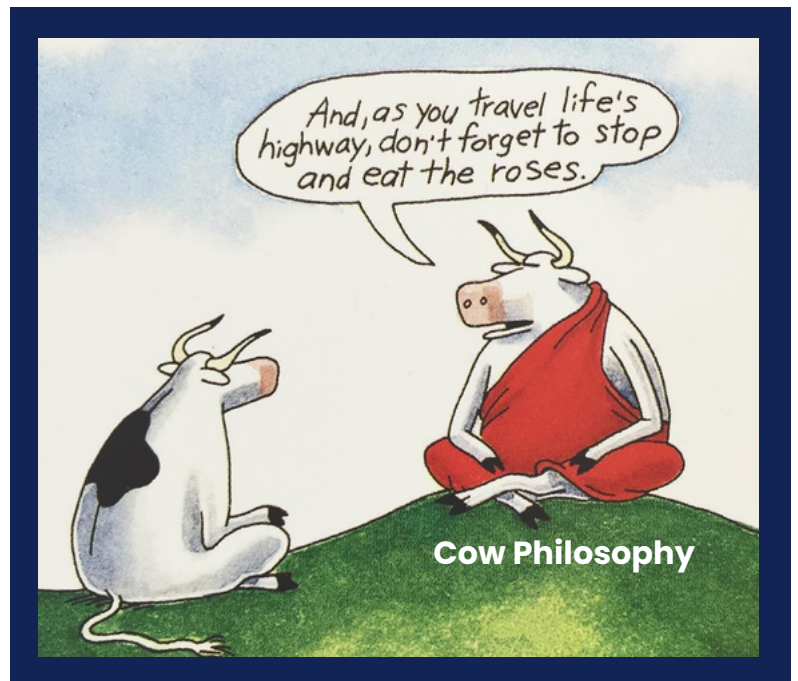
